Annual European Meteorological Society Young Scientist Award

In order to support excellence among young European scientists, EMS honours each year one promising young scientist with the Annual European Meteorological Society Young Scientist Award. This award includes a sum of 1000 € and the reimbursement of travel and local costs for the winner's participation in the entire EMS Annual Meeting at which the award is presented.

Who is entitled to receive a Young Scientist Award?

Young scientists from countries which are EMS Members are entitled to receive an award. For a country overview please consult the EMS Web Site (www.emetsoc.org).

What is the maximum age?

Recipients shall be under 32 years of age on the first of January of the calendar year in which the award will be presented.

What are the requirements?

The candidate must have written a high quality publication in a reviewed international scientific journal, or an outstanding PhD thesis. The paper shall have been published in a three years' span before nomination.

What documentation is requested?

In order to qualify for a Young Scientist Award the following documents are required: (i) a short curriculum vitae, (ii) a document to determine the age of the candidate, (iii) a supporting statement (e.g. by an EMS Member Society or an EMS Associate Member) and (iv) three copies of the proposed paper or PhD thesis in English. If a PhD thesis is not available in English, a publication based on this thesis in a reviewed journal (in English) is requested. Instead of printed versions, access to electronic versions of the paper or thesis shall be sufficient.

Who can recommend a candidate for the Young Scientist Award? The following bodies may recommend candidates: (i) any EMS Member or Associate Member and (ii) the EMS Awards Committee.

How many candidates can be proposed? Each of the aforementioned bodies may nominate up to two candidates per year.

Where should the proposals be submitted?

What is the deadline for the proposals? Proposals should be arriving no later than six weeks prior to the start of the EMS Annual Meeting.

How will the Awards be presented?

The Awards will be presented during the Annual Meeting of the EMS. Moreover, the recipient will receive a certificate, a cheque, a letter of congratulations, a request for report on the usefulness of the award, and a disclaimer of any liability whatsoever arising out of acceptance of the award.
